NABIP-Dallas: Legislative Chair Report

Why Texas' Interim Charges Matter for Health Coverage

As the Texas Legislature moves into the interim, this is one of the most important times of the entire legislative cycle for health coverage, affordability, and access. The hearings and studies that happen now will shape the conversation heading into the 2027 session, and that means the decisions made this summer can have a real impact on employers, employees, and consumers across Texas.

That is why I am honored to testify before the Texas House Committee on Insurance. The issues before the committee are not abstract for those of us working in the field every day. Small businesses are struggling to provide meaningful health coverage, families are feeling the pressure of rising premiums and out-of-pocket costs, and brokers and agents are seeing firsthand how growing complexity is affecting access and choice.

What I will tell lawmakers

In my testimony, I plan to share what brokers and agents are seeing on the front lines of the market. We are helping Texas employers navigate a system that is becoming more expensive and more complicated every year. The cost of coverage continues to rise, compliance obligations are increasing, and too often the real-world experience of consumers is getting lost in policy debates.

I will also emphasize that brokers are not just salespeople – we are trusted advisors who help employers and families understand options, compare coverage, and make decisions that fit their needs and budgets. When lawmakers talk about affordability, access, and market stability, they need to hear directly from the professionals who are dealing with those issues every day.

Why the interim charges matter

The interim charges issued by both the Texas House and Senate show that lawmakers are focused on affordability, regulatory oversight, and the drivers of rising health care costs. That creates an important opportunity for us to bring practical, market-based insight into the process before bills are written for the next session.

This is especially important because the Senate has directed its Health and Human Services Committee to study the causes of rising health care costs, including the role of pharmacy benefit managers, facility fees, and other cost drivers that affect premiums and employer decisions. Those are exactly the kinds of issues that deserve close scrutiny if we want to preserve choice and keep coverage within reach for working Texans.

The House interim process is also significant because it gives committees a chance to review how existing laws are working, what barriers remain, and where administrative burden is getting in the way of better outcomes. That kind of review matters when employers are already facing pressure from every direction.

What Texas should focus on?

If Texas wants to improve health coverage in a meaningful way, there are several areas that deserve attention.

First, we need to look honestly at the drivers of cost growth, including pharmacy pricing, facility fees, and the hidden forces that make coverage more expensive for employers and families. Second, we need to reduce unnecessary administrative burdens that make it harder for small businesses to offer coverage. Third, we should preserve plan flexibility and consumer choice while making sure employees actually understand what they are buying and using.

Most importantly, lawmakers need to keep listening to the people who work directly with employers and consumers. The brokers, agents, and benefits professionals in Texas see the consequences of policy decisions long before those effects show up in headlines or committee reports.

A message for this summer

This summer's interim hearings are more than a formality. They are a chance to lay groundwork for smarter policy in 2027. If the Legislature is serious about affordability, access, and stability, then it should use this interim to gather the right facts, ask the tough questions, and hear from the people who are closest to the marketplace.

I intend to make sure the voice of brokers and the real experience of Texas employers are part of that conversation.

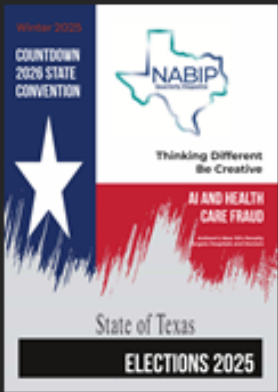

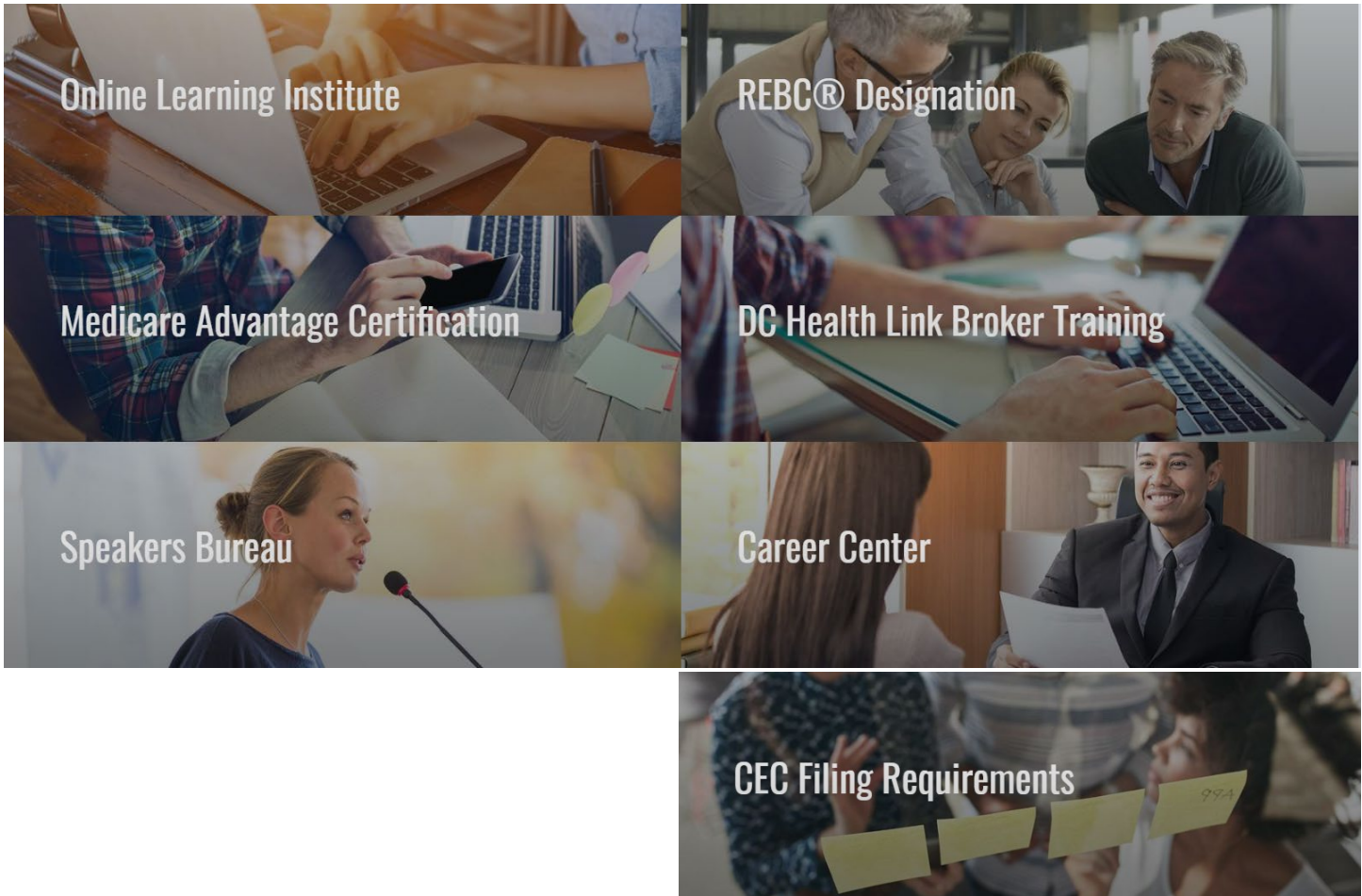

NABIP Dallas is proud to spotlight **Caitlin Mathis**, our Chapter Secretary, for her extraordinary commitment to advocacy, education, and community impact.

On May 19, Caitlin served as a featured presenter at the **21st Annual Conference on Crimes Against Women (CCAW)** alongside the **Stalking Prevention, Awareness, and Resource Center (SPARC)**. The nationally recognized conference brings together law enforcement professionals, victim advocates, prosecutors, and community leaders dedicated to preventing violence and improving victim safety.

The session, *Stalking Lethality in Sharp Focus*, examined stalking-specific risk factors and the importance of early threat assessment in preventing violence. Drawing from Caitlin's personal experience as a stalking survivor, the presentation highlighted how quickly stalking behaviors can escalate and the critical role advocates, law enforcement, and allied professionals play in identifying risks and protecting victims.

Through her partnership with SPARC and ongoing advocacy efforts, Caitlin has become a respected voice in stalking prevention awareness, helping educate professionals across the country on victim safety, risk assessment, and the realities faced by survivors.

In addition to her service to the community, Caitlin is an active leader within NABIP Dallas, serving as Chapter Secretary and supporting the organization's mission of professional development, advocacy, and member engagement.

CMS Releases 2027 Medicare Agent and Broker Compensation Rates

CMS has [released](#) its Contract Year 2027 agent and broker compensation rates, referral/finder's fee amounts, and related guidance for Medicare Advantage organizations, Part D sponsors, and Section 1876 cost plans.

The guidance includes several notable developments for agents and brokers. Medicare Advantage compensation rates increased by approximately 4.5 percent over 2026 levels, while Part D compensation rates increased by approximately 14 percent. CMS is also requesting voluntary carrier reporting of additional compensation data, including plan-specific payments and instances where agents receive \$0 compensation. In addition, CMS cautioned carriers about enrollment barriers that make it difficult for beneficiaries to access enrollment forms, signaling increased scrutiny of practices that may limit consumer choice.

These actions reflect many of the concerns raised by agents, state regulators, and NABIP regarding compensation transparency, market manipulation, and beneficiary access. NABIP works closely with CMS on issues affecting agents, brokers, and the Medicare beneficiaries they serve, and we appreciate CMS's attention to these important issues. We will continue advocating for a fair marketplace that supports informed consumer choice and recognizes the value agents provide to Medicare beneficiaries.

NABIP Elevates Agent and Broker Perspective at CCIIO Meeting

NABIP had a strong presence at this week's CCIIO Agent & Broker Meetup in Baltimore, where more than 200 agents, brokers, carriers, vendor solution partners, association representatives, and federal officials came together for a day focused on the future of the individual market and Marketplace. The event provided an important opportunity for NABIP to engage directly with CCIIO, elevate the agent and broker perspective, and reinforce the essential role our members play in helping consumers understand and access coverage.

NABIP Director of Health Policy and Engagement Nicole LePetri attended the event, and several NABIP members helped shape the program through their participation in panel discussions. Their involvement ensured that the practical experience of agents and brokers was reflected throughout the conversation, including discussions of the HHS Notice of Benefit and Payment Parameters for 2027.

NABIP members contributed to several panel discussions, including:

- **Emily Trevino** and **Justin Reinig** discussed how Individual Coverage Health Reimbursement Arrangements (ICHRA) are emerging as a group coverage solution driven by ACA agents and brokers.
- **Rebecca Yates** shared practical ways agents and brokers can leverage AI to strengthen business operations, improve efficiency, and create more time to meet with and serve clients.

The event concluded with roundtable discussions and networking, giving NABIP and other stakeholders from across the Marketplace ecosystem an opportunity to exchange ideas, build relationships, and discuss the issues shaping the individual market. NABIP values its close working relationship with CCIIO and CMS and will continue working closely with both agencies to advocate for agents, brokers, employers, and the consumers they serve.

House Energy and Commerce Committee to Examine Health Care Transparency and Costs Proposals

Next Wednesday, June 10, the House Energy and Commerce Committee will hold a hearing titled "Lowering Health Care Costs for All Americans: Examining Policies to Increase Health Care Transparency."

The Committee will examine several legislative proposals related to healthcare transparency and costs, including:

Price Transparency

- Increase pricing transparency requirements for hospitals, providers, health plans, insurers, and PBMs (Lower Costs, More Transparency Act of 2026).
- Require hospitals to physically display cash prices for certain CMS-designated shoppable services.
- Expand transparency requirements for hospital, laboratory, and imaging service pricing (H.R. 5582, Patients Deserve Price Tags Act).

Insurance and Utilization Transparency

- Require insurers and Medicare Advantage plans to report premium revenue, claims spending, administrative costs, and retained earnings.
- Require reporting of prior authorization approvals, denials, appeals, and response times.

Employer Plan Data Access

- Improve employer health plans' access to claims, reimbursement, fee, and rebate information held by TPAs, PBMs, provider networks, and other vendors (H.R. 9117, CHECK Act).

Medicare Advantage Oversight

- Require additional reporting in Medicare Advantage encounter data, including allowed amounts, beneficiary cost-sharing, and health risk assessment information.
- Revisit limits on Medicare Advantage agent and broker compensation and require additional compensation reporting.

Health Care Ownership Transparency

- Require certain healthcare entities to report ownership structures, mergers and acquisitions, and related financial information to HHS.

NABIP is closely reviewing these proposals, including provisions that could have significant implications for licensed agents and brokers, employer-sponsored coverage, Medicare Advantage enrollment, and consumers' ability to receive trusted, individualized guidance. We will attend the hearing, continue analyzing the legislation and setting up meetings, and provide members with a more detailed update following next week's hearing.

CMS Announces Medicare GLP-1 Bridge Resources and Pharmacy Webinar

CMS will expand access to certain GLP-1 medications for eligible Medicare Part D beneficiaries who currently lack access to these medications through the Part D benefit. CMS has released new educational materials in support of the Medicare GLP-1 Bridge, a short-term demonstration that will begin on July 1, 2026:

- [Prescriber Fact Sheet](#)– Key information for prescribers referring patients to the Medicare GLP-1 Bridge.
- [Pharmacy Fact Sheet](#)– Guidance for pharmacies on billing and dispensing under the demonstration.
- [Prior Authorization Form](#)–Outline of clinical criteria for Medicare GLP-1 Bridge eligibility.

CMS will also host an informational pharmacy webinar to provide background on the Medicare GLP-1 Bridge and technical instructions to help pharmacies fill prescriptions under the demonstration beginning July 1. The webinar will also include a live Q&A session and will be closed to the public and press.
